Responsibilities

- Place the health, safety, and wellness of our member participants above all else
- Execute a weekly menu including breakfast, lunch, dinner and snack
- Train volunteer kitchen crew on proper food safety protocols and standards
- Maintain cleanliness and sanitation of the kitchen area pursuant to Department of Health standards
- Perform mandatory daily and pre/post trip inspection of assigned vehicle
- Notify Culinary Director and Corps Director of any equipment failure, safety concerns, and/or operational issues
- Report on inventory levels to the Culinary Director
- Adapt to individual needs relating to food allergies, vegetarian, and vegan meals.
- Other responsibilities as assigned

Requirements

- Bachelor's degree or equivalent work experience preferred
- 2+ Years experience in food service industry
- Catering/industrial kitchen experience is a plus
- Comfortable in a fast-paced, change-oriented environment, skilled in dealing with young adults
- Must have personality and character traits suited to working with and care of passengers of multiple ethnicities, cultural values, behavioral tendencies and physical handicaps.
