

Job Title: Props Manager

Reports To: Corps Director

Position Overview:

The Props Manager is responsible for overseeing and maintaining all props used in performances, ensuring they are in working order, transported safely, and set up efficiently during rehearsals and competitions. This individual will work closely with design staff, instructional staff, and volunteers to execute smooth and effective prop deployment. The ideal candidate is a detail-oriented, proactive problem solver who thrives in a fast-paced, team-oriented environment.

Responsibilities:

- Ensure all props are in working order, repaired as needed, and ready for rehearsals and performances.
- Work with design and instructional staff to understand the visual and logistical requirements for props.
- Organize the transportation, loading, unloading, and setup of props at all performance venues.
- Lead a team of volunteers and assigned staff in the assembly and disassembly of props.
- Maintain an inventory of all props, tools, and supplies, coordinating repairs or replacements as needed.
- Assist in training members and volunteers on proper handling and use of props.
- Work with the logistics team to ensure timely and safe transport of all equipment.
- Ensure all props comply with DCI (Drum Corps International) regulations and safety guidelines.
- Will be a part of creating a props plan to submit to DCI (Drum Corps International)

Requirements:

- Must be 22 years or older.
- Experience in prop construction, set design, or related fields preferred.
- Ability to lift and carry heavy objects and work in various weather conditions.
- Strong organizational and problem-solving skills.
- Comfortable in a fast-paced, dynamic environment.
- Ability to communicate effectively and work collaboratively with members, staff, and volunteers.
- Open to training and willing to adapt to Troopers rules, policies, and procedures.
- Previous experience in drum corps, marching band, or theater production preferred but not required.
