If selected, you will have the experience of touring with a world-class production act and crew and will gain hands-on experience with professional audio equipment and implementation strategies.

#### RESPONSIBILITIES

Help build the audio system and maintain said system throughout spring training and the summer tour. Mix rehearsals and shows during spring training and the summer tour. Work with the caption heads and design team to ensure the system operates as designed and that the mix meets Troopers standards.

Run RF position during shows and manage frequency coordination at show sites as needed Interact with students on how to maintain consistency with audio equipment. Communicate with audio systems designer for daily notes and task
